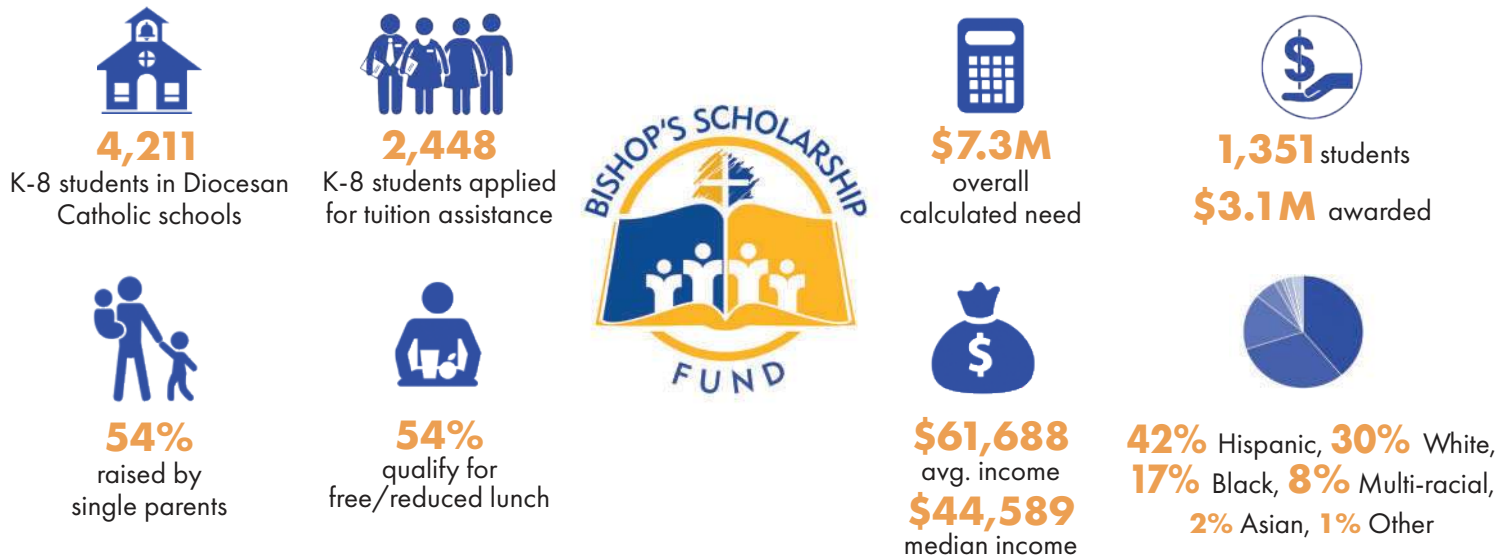

Bishop's Scholarship Fund

The mission of the Bishop's Scholarship Fund (BSF) is to help families afford Catholic elementary school tuition in the Diocese of Bridgeport. To date, over \$23 million has been awarded to thousands of students who demonstrate financial need while attending Diocesan schools in Fairfield County.

In 2023-2024, 1,351 students were awarded nearly \$3.1 million.



Leaders of Tomorrow (LOT) is a select program of BSF representing students who qualify for tuition assistance and have been identified by their principal as having strong academics, good character and leadership potential.

Donors provide Leaders full (\$6,000), half (\$3,000) or quarter (\$1,500) scholarships and are invited to an annual reception to meet their scholar and celebrate Catholic education.

This year, donors sponsored a record-breaking 131 Leaders of Tomorrow Scholars!

Donor-Driven Scholarships

FIE donors believe that Catholic education transforms lives. The following donors partnered with FIE to create ongoing scholarships that aid families in providing their children with a transformative Catholic education.

MARY ALICE AND THOMAS O'MALLEY SCHOLARSHIP

In 2018, the O'Malleys committed \$500,000 to establish a high school scholarship to benefit children of firefighters, police officers, and hospital nurses in Greenwich or Stamford. The scholarship provides up to 80% of tuition and is renewable provided parents' employment eligibility remains unchanged and students maintain strong academics and good standing as noted in the school's code of conduct.

Now in its sixth year, ten O'Malley Scholars were awarded \$142,344. To date, thirty-one awards totaling \$532,566 were made on behalf of twenty-one students.



JS HOWE FAMILY NEW STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

In 2022, the JS Howe Family Foundation established a scholarship to support new students at Diocesan elementary schools. An annual \$50,000 grant supports students up to 90% tuition for their first year. The scholarship is intended to help families as they transition to Catholic schools, recognizing the inherent value in a Catholic school education.

Now in its second year, the JS Howe Family New Student Scholarship provided seven new students the opportunity to attend Catholic Schools. To date, fifteen students have been awarded \$98,600.



MAXIMILIAN KOLBE SCHOLARSHIP

In 2021, Cindy and John Sites created a scholarship to provide half and full scholarships for eligible students at Kolbe Cathedral High School in Bridgeport. Scholarship recipients are selected at the Principal's discretion beginning freshman year and are renewable, as funds allow, for four consecutive years. Consideration may be made for students whose parents are public servants or first-responders. Eligibility includes merit based academic performance, demonstrated work ethic and affinity for the "Kolbe Cathedral Experience."

Now in its third year, thirteen Maximilian Kolbe Scholars were awarded \$82,175. To date, forty-two awards totaling \$246,525 were made on behalf of twenty students.



ST. JOSEPH/ST. LADISLAUS PARISH in Norwalk has invested in Foundations in Education to support the Bishop's Scholarship Fund as an opportunity for parishioners. The parish funding is directed to aiding parishioners in their efforts to provide their family with a transformative Catholic education, while strengthening their commitment to All Saints Catholic School and St. Joseph/St. Ladislaus Parish.

Now in its second year, four St. Joseph/St. Ladislaus Scholars were awarded \$12,050. To date, seven students were awarded \$29,162.



Innovation and Leadership Grants

In its seventh year, this competitive grant program was the first of its kind to offer innovation and leadership grants to teachers and administrators which promote excellence in the Diocese of Bridgeport Catholic Schools. To date, nearly **\$920,000** in grants have been awarded.

An awards reception was held at Sacred Heart University's Discovery Science Center and Planetarium announcing twenty-seven grant awards totaling \$150,000.

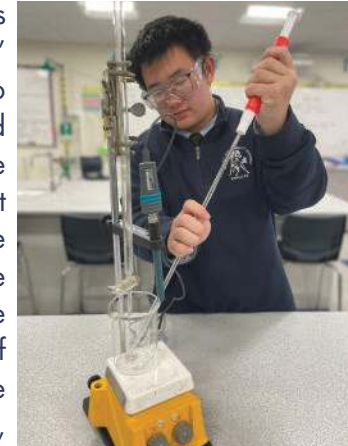

This year, for the first time, the FIE Grants Committee promoted a specific project, encouraging a group of intrepid educators to integrate Lego Education STEM Learning Tools in their instruction. Thirteen grantees across ten schools comprised the cohort of awardees who will be trained on Lego Spike education.

TRANSFORMING STUDENT LEARNING - IT STARTS WITH AN IDEA

The Grants program encourages teachers to “dare to dream” to create an innovative opportunity for their students. Special thanks to the donors who value innovation and leadership in the classroom and make this transformative experience possible.

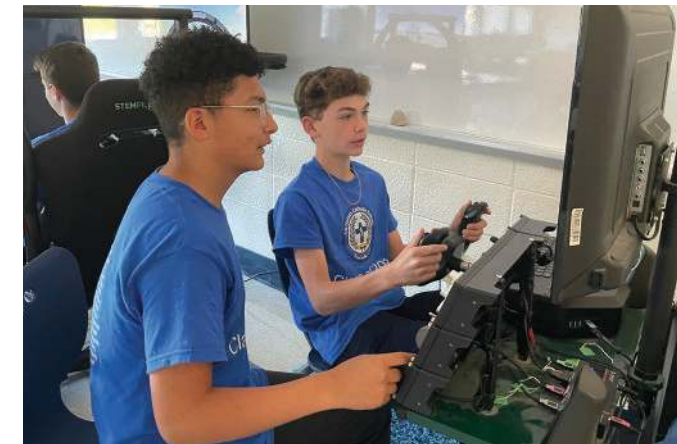
Immaculate High School in Danbury used grant funds to enhance laboratory equipment in order to offer the UConn ECE Chemistry course (Early College Education, dual enrollment with AP). The pH probes and spectrophotometers connect directly to students' laptops to allow them to individually analyze and process the raw data. The buret clamps, pipets, pipet bulbs, and burets were all necessary to teach the proper techniques to make accurate concentrations of solutions, then carry out the experiments involving pH, kinetics, dilutions, and spectrophotometry.



“Labs are critical for science classes in order for students to understand the concepts. The grant has allowed students to do multiple lab experiments which has helped excite them, engage them, and ultimately enjoy the course even more.”

All Saints Catholic School in Norwalk was awarded grant funds this past year to purchase a STEM Pilot



aimed at teaching students the theory of flight integrating science and math while they learn to fly on a flight simulator. The STEM Pilot training was integrated into a new Engineering program for Upper School.

“The program is helping students with problem solving skills, collaboration, and critical thinking processes and teaching them principles of flight leveraging STEM concepts such as geometry, algebra, trigonometry, physics, meteorology, geography and topography. In just the first year, students have improved their math, science, engineering and problem solving skills.”

St. James School in Stratford used grant funds to introduce drone technology to seventh and eighth graders in a makerspace setting. Students worked cooperatively to complete challenges and learned time management and how to handle delicate equipment.

TEACHER FORMATION AND SUPPORT

This year, TPCE coaches visited classrooms with a primary focus on English Language Arts and Mathematics. In the spring, they offered a three-day intensive visit to schools that provided coaching, planning, modeling, preparing, data analysis, and more time with teachers.

ONGOING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

In addition to coaching sessions, the program enabled the 2nd Annual Teacher Planning Day, which provided teachers a summer opportunity to collaborate, network, and prepare for the upcoming school year. Coaches are exploring an instructional model called Modern Classrooms Project where teachers create instructional videos in lieu of traditional lecture. This gives students the opportunity to re-watch the lesson if needed which can make them more independent learners.

Kolbe Transformation Project

This project includes multiple pillars such as the Student Success Center to implement personalized learning, the Marian Work Study Program to provide work-study and internship opportunities, and the Saint Joseph Parenting Center to engage and support families.

THE MARIAN WORK STUDY PROGRAM provides:

- internship opportunities with mentors who help students build the tools and skills necessary for future gainful employment thereby closing the financial disparity gap;
- access to industry contacts and professional positions in fields they normally would not have; and
- scholarship funding to offset high school tuition

In its inaugural school year, the program partnered with over 40 corporations, businesses, nonprofits and institutions from New Haven to Greenwich to place junior and senior high school students one day each week into a nine-month unpaid internship within their future field of study. The pilot year has been marked by numerous successes that go beyond measurable outcomes. These stories highlight the profound impact on students' lives, emphasizing personal growth, professional development, and academic achievement.

David Van Vlack Endowed Scholarship Fund

David Van Vlack’s estate gift sends ripples far into the future!

David Van Vlack was a parishioner and trustee of Our Lady of Assumption Church in Fairfield, CT as well as a member of the Knights of Columbus. He had been a resident of Fairfield for 27 years, and recently at the age of 60, was born into eternal life. During his lifetime, David arranged for a bequest to endow the



David Van Vlack Scholarship Fund to provide scholarships to young area students, so they may attend Catholic schools in the communities near his home.

David had a keen and personal appreciation of Catholic education, having graduated from Iona Preparatory School in 1980 and received a Bachelor of Arts from Fordham University in 1984. He went on to earn a Master of Business Administration from Pace University in 1987 building on the strong foundations his Catholic education provided.



Mr. Van Vlack worked for 35 years in the field of finance, first as an Investment Manager for Fosterlane Management and later in Corporate Finance roles for the Blackstone Group. At Blackstone, David headed the group that administered employee investments in the firm’s funds, as well as employee compensation resulting directly from fund performance. He finished his career as a Managing Director in charge of the firm’s equity program, administering equity as a form of employee compensation as well as reporting on equity related expense to the firm’s income statement and other SEC-required disclosures.

David was devoted to friends and family. Formed in the Jesuit tradition of “men for others,” he was long a supporter of Catholic education. He provided educational opportunities for children who otherwise might lack these educational experiences. In establishing the David Van Vlack Scholarship Fund, David cemented his legacy of care and will continue his commitment to Catholic education, a true gift of a lifetime.

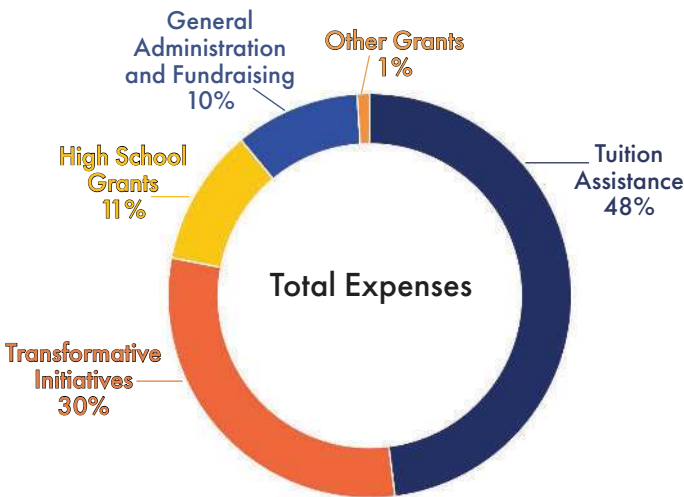
